## **Fort Sumter**

\* The Union troops had moved from their original fort to Fort Sumter. Food supplies began to dwindle in late March, and the women and children were sent home.

\* Lincoln tried to get supplies to the fort, but the Confederates had blocked the bay.

\* The Confederates told the commander of the fort, Anderson, that he had to surrender his flag by 4:00 A.M., April 12.

\* Anderson refused, and at 4:12 A.M. on April 12, 1861, the Civil War began.

\* The fighting is useless. The only casualty was a Confederate horse. Lacking supplies, and no immediate opportunity to get any, Anderson surrendered.
